Dear Friends,

Someone asked a certain priest if Jesus Christ was his personal Saviour, he replied, "Well, in fact I like to share him!" Salvation in Jesus Christ is a gift of our God to the entire human race and has to do with everyone, as the Gospel so well illustrates today. As Jesus went about from place to place, town to town, he likewise sent his disciples to announce that the kingdom of God is at hand. The Lord continues to call us in our respective vocations to do likewise. the Lord sends his disciples out two by two, rather than all alone because with two or more bearing witness, there is always a better possibility of giving testimony to the meaning of love and unity among the disciples.

Our Church is a community of believers. It is composed of individuals, yes, but most importantly, they form an "ecclesia," a church or community, constantly called to move forward together under the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit. As the poet John Donne expressed it, "No man is an island," and that is just as true today as in ages past. The message of the kingdom of God is at once simple and at the same time very demanding. All of the preaching of Jesus was and is centred on the theme of the Kingdom of God, which includes that essential message of redemption in Jesus Christ through the shedding of his blood. Jesus' mission did not end with an announcement only, but with the actual establishment of God's kingdom in the risen Christ, extending to all times, places and peoples. We best proclaim the Gospel by our lives, with simple and few words perhaps, but with an efficacy that flows from a direct, sincere, concise and humble response to Jesus' message here and now.

Appeal for my native village

I am from a village called Nachugunta, a remote Dalit area situated in Arthamuru (post), Bantumilli (Mandal), Krishna (District), Andhra Pradesh (State), South India. Dalits are the people who are considered the outcaste by the upper caste people in India. They are not in the mainstream of even the living areas; they are away from the village of other castes. There are around 120 families in my village (Naachugunta Maalapalli). The main occupation of my villagers is cooly i.e. the daily wage work in the in the farms of the agricultural landlords, who are but upper caste people. Dalits own no land of their own. They need work every day to earn their daily bread. But they do not have the work once the plantation is done in rainy season. So they go away to other states like Tamil Nadu (Chennai which is Madras), and Telangana (Hyderabad) in search of the work for their livelihood until it is time for harvesting. Some go away far from our village to find the work as servants who can be watchmen/women to look after the fish ponds of the landlords.

This struggle of the poor people traveling seasonally time and again for their daily bread doesn't leave any chance for their children to have proper schooling. Most of my village children still struggle to complete the high school education, if saying - even primary school - wouldn't surprise you. They take money on loan for interest, when they face unexpected ill health. These amounts on interest from the landlords turn out eventually to be amounts to be paid back on compound interest over the years. This, sadly sometimes leaves the children of theirs as paleru (a bonded labourer) for unlimited number of years in the house of the landlord.

So, this is an endeavour to support these parents of my village of Nachugunta to send their children to school as we encourage and help the children to go to school and not to drop-out. This will allow one of the parents/guardians to stay back home. We believe only the good education can change the fate of my people from this social stigma of being untouchables in our country and from the cycle of debts and bondage. Thank you all very much for reading the story of my village.
