Reflection from Fr. Vijay

The Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (November 16, 2025) presents a powerful message about the end times, judgment, and the enduring presence of God. The readings—Malachi 3:19-20a, 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12, and Luke 21:5-19—invite us to reflect on how we live in the present while preparing for the future. So, in these final weeks of the liturgical year, the Church turns our gaze toward the end—both of time and of our personal journey. But this is not to frighten us. It is to **awaken us**. Are we living with purpose? Are we idle or engaged? Are we fearful or faithful?

The readings remind us that **God's justice is real**, but so is His mercy. The trials we face—whether personal, societal, or global—are not signs of abandonment but opportunities to witness, to persevere, and to grow in holiness.

Let us not be distracted by the grandeur of temples or the chaos of the world. Let us fix our eyes on Christ, the true temple, and live each day as if it were our last–not in fear, but in **faith, hope, and love**.
